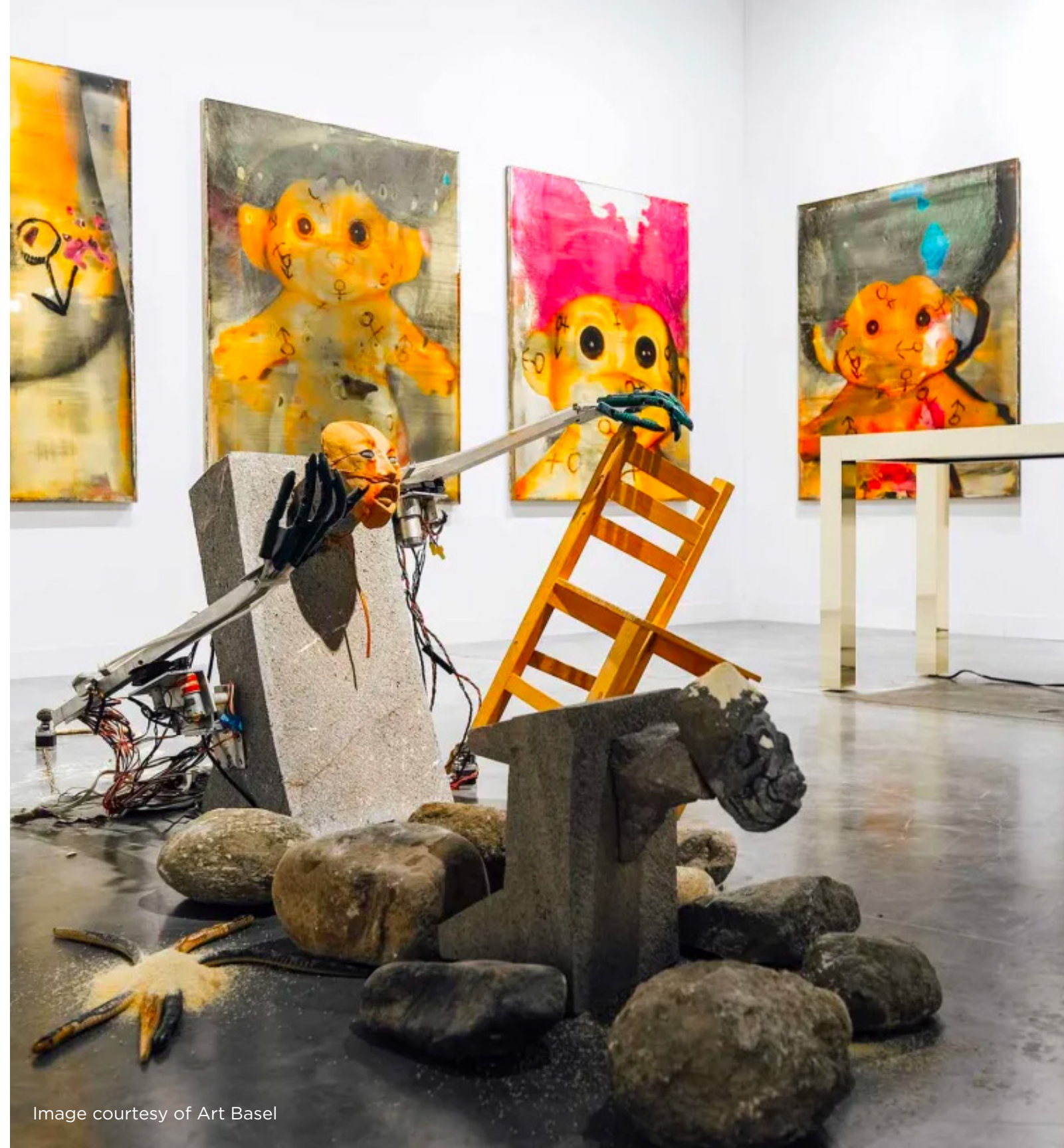

Checkout of The Palms Hotel and Spa is at 11am.

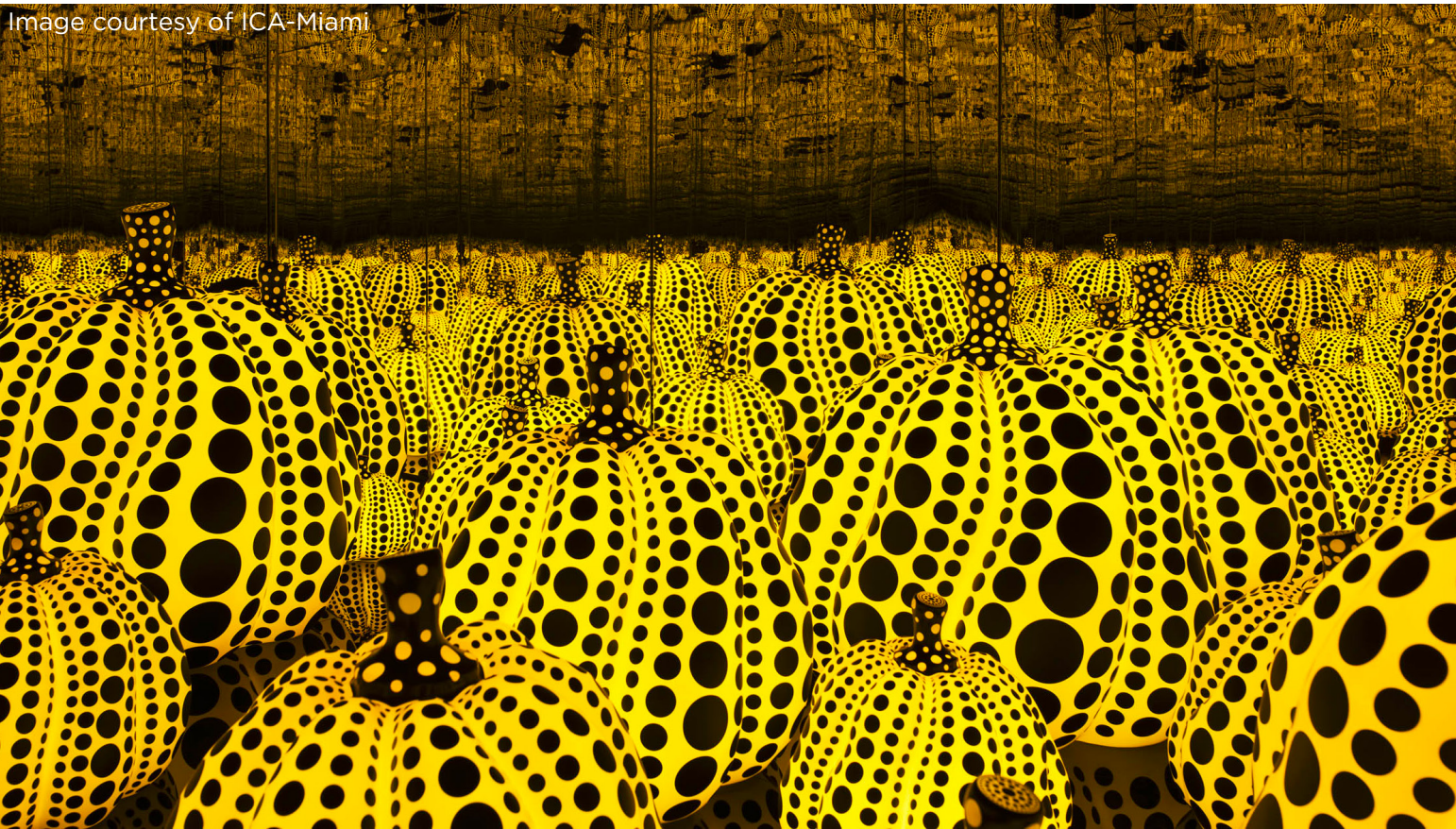
Breakfast:

Below is a list of museums in the area you may be interested in checking out on your own during the rest of your stay in Miami in addition to visiting “Untitled” as you have planned on Sunday. Each listing has a highlight of some of the exhibitions that will be up during December.

The Bass Museum

The Bass is Miami Beach’s contemporary art museum. Focusing on exhibitions of international contemporary art, The Bass presents mid-career and established artists reflecting the spirit and international character of Miami Beach. The Bass seeks to expand the interpretation of contemporary art by incorporating disciplines of contemporary culture, such as design, fashion and architecture, into the exhibition program. The exhibition program encompasses a wide range of media and artistic points of view that bring new thought to the diverse cultural context of Miami Beach.

Notable Exhibitions:

Yayoi Kusama, All the Eternal Love I Have for the Pumpkins

Yayoi Kusama is a pioneering installation artist and painter whose celebrated career spans over six decades. Her “Infinity Mirror Rooms” are some of her most experimental and iconic works, often incorporating a variety of illuminated objects. The “Infinity Mirror Rooms” remain as challenging and unclassifiable today as when they debuted in 1965, immersing visitors in dazzling environments that produce an almost hallucinatory effect through reflection and repetition.

Perez Art Museum Miami

Notable Exhibitions:

Jose Carlos Martinat, American Echo Chamber

José Carlos Martinat created American Echo Chamber, an installation that responds to the amplification and reinforcement of ideas in the current social and political landscape. This large-scale work is composed of mechanical light sculptures that collectively generate a dramatic and entertaining space for visual consumption. The sculptures are inspired by symbols of both American and Peruvian cultures ranging from historical images such as the political cartoon “Join, or Die” attributed to founding father Benjamin Franklin to popular internet memes. These symbols are often composed of images related to violence, manipulation, racism, or migration.
